<h3>Scaffolding Awareness</h3>	
<p>Overview</p>	<p>Participants will be refreshed on Scaffolding Awareness fundamentals and responsibilities. The scaffolding awareness course is conducted through a combination of practical demonstration and verbal questioning and the ability to perform tasks to the National Occupational Health & Safety Standard and Worksafe Victoria Standards. The course is designed as an introduction for those who wish to know the basics of modular scaffold erection and dismantling. This course is most suitable for labourers, prospective scaffolders, supervisors and graduate engineers. This course will involve some manual handling, climbing, lifting, carrying and height work.</p>
